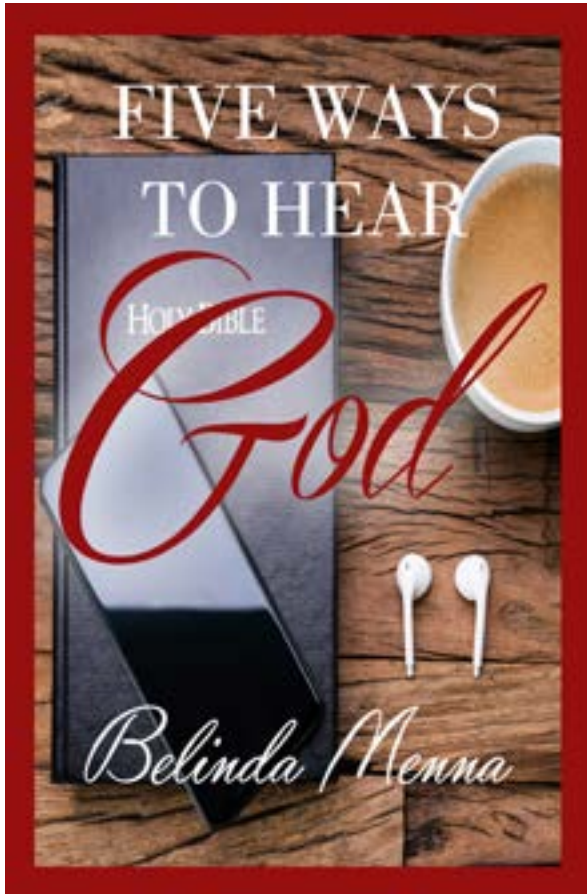

God Through His Word



2 Tim. 16-17  
The Word of God is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

One of the ways we learn to hear God starts with His Scriptures. In 1 Tim. 4:16 (NIV) it says, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." Notice that "Word" is capitalized and presented as a noun, which means that it is a person or thing. In this context it is a person and is written over 50 times in the form of a noun. John 1:1-2 (NIV), it reads, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning when John Ch. 1 vs. 14 (NIV) where it says, "The Word became flesh and then to serve fourteen how the Word became flesh. Here is a beautiful picture of how Jesus was with God in heaven (think of by being born of Mary). 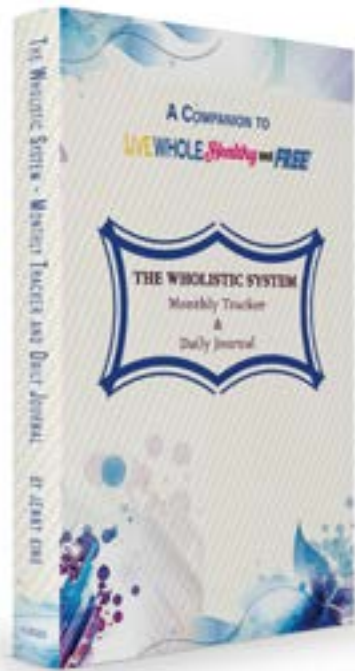

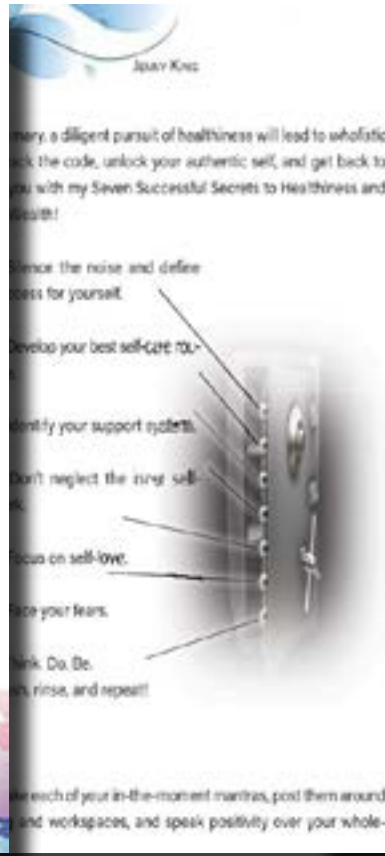




**INTRODUCTION**

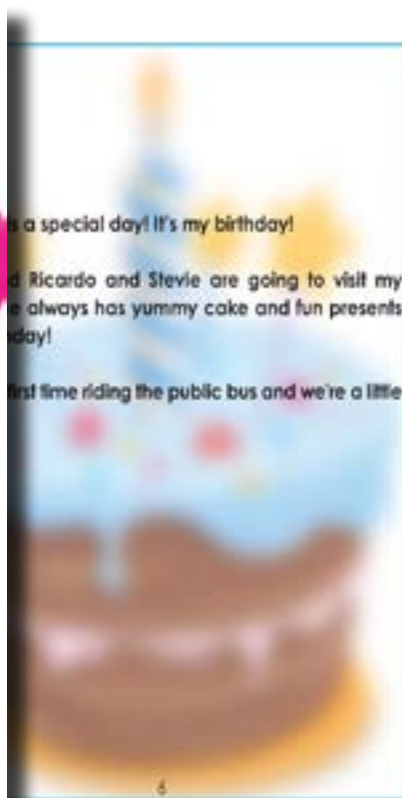
## BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE IN GOALS

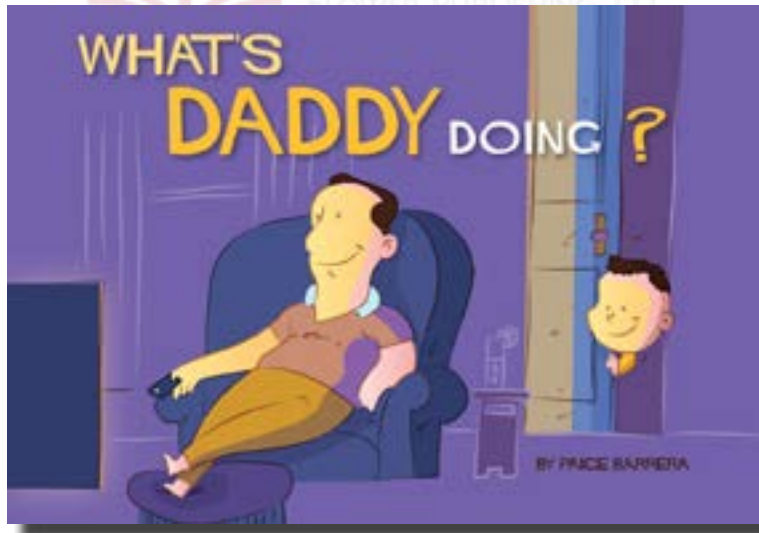

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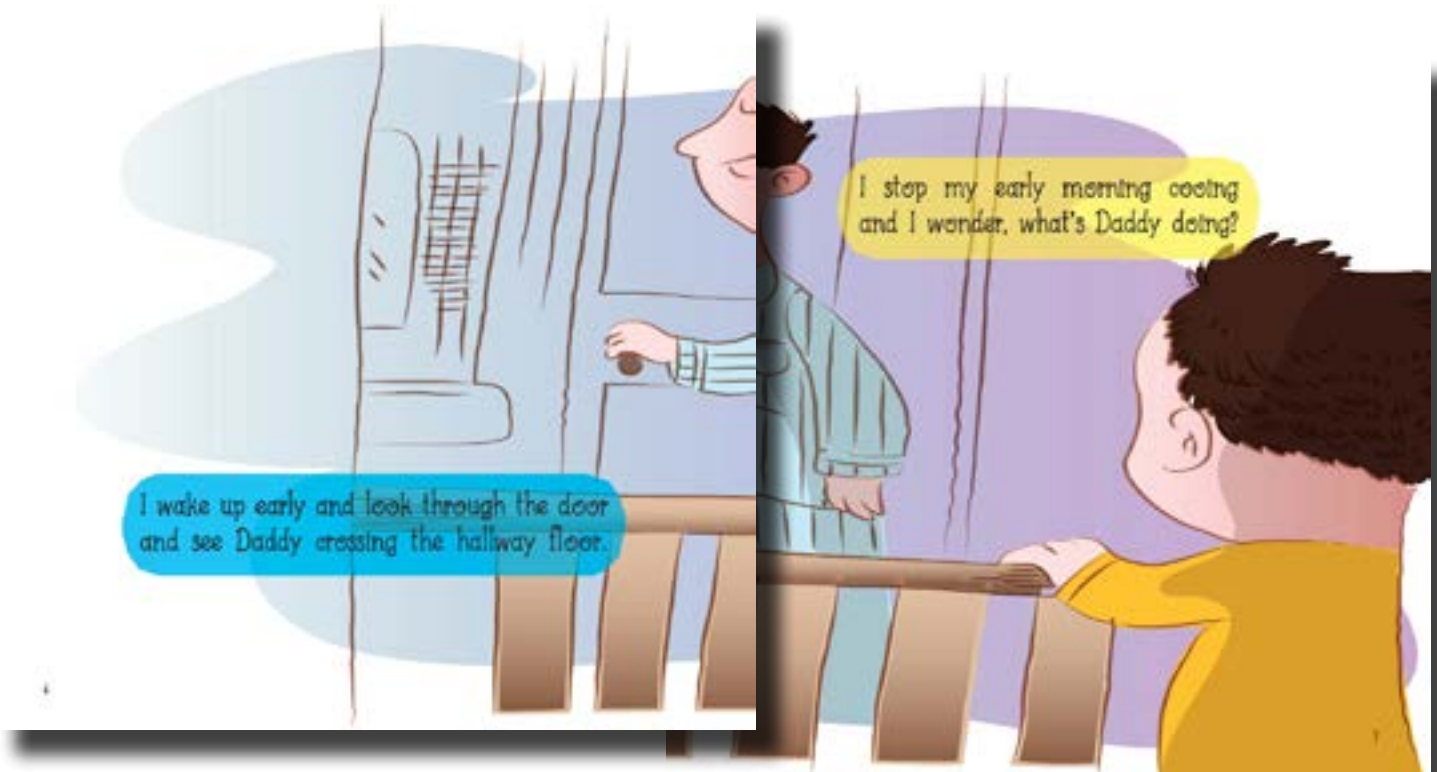

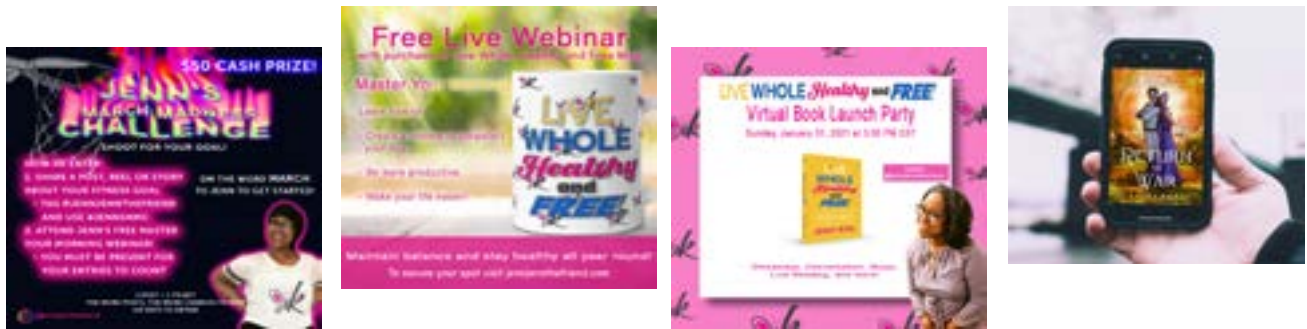
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
